

15 indoor activity ideas for rainy days



1 Crafting challenges

Set up a mini crafting station with paper, glue and scissors and challenge your kids to create something fun like a homemade card or sculpture.

3 Baking together

Bake some simple treats like cookies or cupcakes and let the kids get involved in measuring, mixing and decorating.

5 Build an indoor den

8 Storytelling time

Get creative by taking turns telling stories. You can even build on each other's tales for a fun group story adventure.

10 Board games and puzzles

12 Indoor gardening

14 Mystery box challenge

Use baking soda, vinegar and food colouring to create a mini volcano eruption. It's a thrilling science experiment that doubles as a messy adventure!
