# Parents show love for school by organising Valentine's Disco for children

### Before working with Parentkind

Parents came to special events like Sports Day and Christmas Concert, they attended Parents' Evenings but had little other interaction with the school.

#### What did the school do?

To test the appetite for a Parents and Friends Association, one of the teachers sent out a request for volunteers to help organise a Valentine's disco for the children. A small group of parents volunteered. In particular they:

- encouraged other parents to get involved
- made decorations to put up in the hall
- served food to the children
- supported with behaviour during the event
- cleaned up afterwards

#### What was the result?

- The children had a great time
- The Valentine's Disco was the best attended disco that the school had held for quite some time

- Approximately £650 was raised towards school funds
- Staff and parents were filled with enthusiasm to continue to work together to raise funds for the school

#### What difficulties have there been?

 It has been difficult to organise official meetings at a time that suits all parents that want to be involved. Some parents are working and unable to make the meetings if held during a school day however non-working parents prefer the day time as they may not have childcare after school hours.

## Lessons learnt – Recommendations for other schools:

- Try to schedule official meetings well in advance of the event
- Look at using MS Teams, Skype or Zoom to encourage more members to attend
- Have different groups a group to arrange and coordinate activities, other groups to make items for sale/decoration/ refreshments etc. or turn up on the day and do specific tasks; that way people can give as much or as little time as they are able.



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
